When Jesus is the Lord of your Christmas, the wonderful blessings of this season are limitless. Celebrate because of Him!

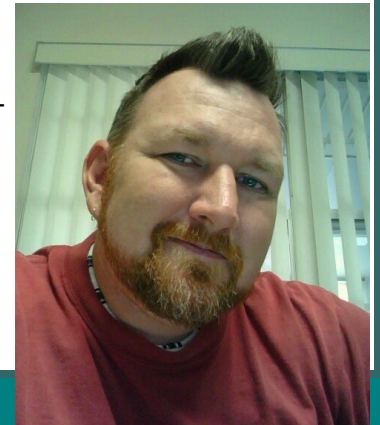
Smooth as Silk



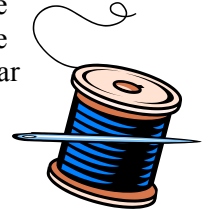
LOVE IN STITCHES DECEMBER 2010

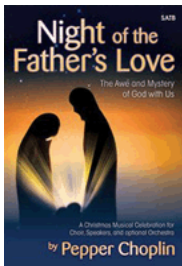

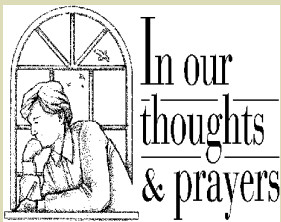

As we come to a close this year and embark on a new one we have many things to be thankful for. The Thrift Boutique has made a tremendous impact on many people in our community and beyond.

We were the second largest donator of luggage in Seminole county for a program for children who are needing to be moved from their present living environment.

We gave over 100 bags of stuffed animals to Boggy Creek Camp in Eustis, Fl. for terminal ill children.

We gave 25 winter coats to a local school this year.

Helped furnish 6 families in new homes and clothed over 30 people through vouchers from the church.

We sent out over 1200 bags of close to tow other thrift stores and assisted in clothes going to Haiti.

We sent more than 50 educational books to a country in Africa to help teach the children English.

We have continue to supply the Humane Society with blankets for kennels.

We continue to build relationships with our customers in an effort to bring them into the family of Christ.
