Michelle and I are currently in the midst of Dave Ramsey's "Financial Peace University". Each Sunday we gather with 14 others as Nancy and Carl Taylor facilitate a video and discussion. This offering in our church has been very successful with over 30 participants in the first two classes. There is a good reason for that popularity.



Ramsey's goal for in life is to help people get out of debt. He makes a compelling case for people to stop living on credit and start gaining momentum in wealth. One of the things he says is that this process isn't easy – that it hurts. Michelle and I and the rest of the class are learning the pains of turning around our financial situations and guess what. It is a bit painful. But Dave Ramsey also explains that if we stick with it. If we work through the tough stuff it will be worth it. That if we live like no other now, we will live like no other later when we live out this change.

That is essentially what our church family is going through. We have been in a debt situation and we are turning that situation around. Two years ago we began a journey to pay down the debt of our church which began at just over 1.6 million dollars. We have attacked the debt from two fronts. First a monthly mortgage payment that is part of our budget. Each month our spending dollars include a payment of \$11,600.00, about half of which goes to pay the interest and the remainder pays down the principle. Meanwhile many families have taken on the additional challenge to give beyond their pledge to our capital campaign fund which pays which pays an additional portion of the principle amount.

The good news is that we have paid over \$300,000.00 of the original debt since we chose to turn things around. The bad news is that is painful. Our budgetary giving has suffered and now we find ourselves struggling month to month to try to make ends meet. I know that this is painful. I have cried over the stress that it has caused. It would seem that things are less than hopeful.

But there is God and there is God's plan. I believe that we can trust God to bring us through. Financial Peace teaches that we should run with passion, like our lives depended on it to end the tyranny of debt. I want to encourage you to keep giving with a passion that says this economy will not destroy us because God is on our side. I pray that instead of shrinking in fear and shrinking what we give, we all will run towards the future God has planned for us. At the end of this battle remember: at the very least we will have \$11,600.00 a month to pour in to God's vision and the lives of those who need to catch that vision. I believe if we are faithful, we will have much more. We will have peace!

I want to ask you to be a church like no other now, so we can be a church like no other later.

Let's play a game. I want you to define the word Justice. Pick one of the following:

- A. principle according to which each person is rewarded or punished in according to that person's deeds.
- B. righteousness, equitableness, or moral rightness:

Let's look at these definitions a little closer. Option A sounds about right, doesn't it?

Think about it: If someone does something to hurt you, or upset you, and something hurtful happens to them in return, do we not call it justice?

Now, let's look at option B. "righteousness, equitableness, or moral rightness." Basically, this comes down to justice equals what is right and fair. This, brothers and sisters in Christ, is the correct definition of justice as we have been discussing at youth group this past month.

When Osama Bin Laden was defeated, the one responsible for taking the lives of so many people and destroying families, do we not believe that we are right to be joyful about the justice that takes place? Should we not rejoice over the justice that has taken place?

Or do we weep over the lost soul that is now and forever separated from God?

"Do not rejoice when your enemy falls,

And do not let your heart be glad when he stumbles." Proverbs 24:17

Friends and family, although justice was served, we are not right to rejoice in a lost life. It is commanded in scripture to love our enemies, and not rejoice when they are defeated. We as Christians have to reset the bar of justice. The term has become too loosely used, and I believe the meaning has been skewed in some effect. We've allowed Justice to no longer mean what is right and fair; instead we are guilty of sometimes transforming it into the "an eye for an eye" concept. Do we have a responsibility to stop those causing injustice? I would say the bible teachers yes, however, the true question is what is our response to it?

Brothers and sisters in Christ, I pray that we can join together as one unit to spread the true meaning of justice. More importantly, I pray that we can show people the one and only true Judge, our Saving Grace, our Father, God.

God is right.

God is fair.

God is justice.

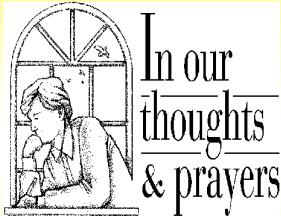
