## Are you a Whiner or a Winner? By Tony Sorrell

Not too long ago our Wednesday night students read the story about Paul and Silas and their interaction with a slave girl who under demon possession was able to predict the future. Her tune was one of harassment and greed as her owner used her to make money when she prophesized. It's a great story from Acts 16 if you want to take a second and get caught up. Don't worry, I'll wait. So, Paul and Silas after their interaction find themselves being beaten and flogged and finally in put in prison after healing her.

Recently I, and nine other members of First Church, returned from working with the victims of the April tornadoes in Apison, TN. They tried to prepare us for what we were about to see when we arrived but we weren't; homes were turned inside out, 4 foot trees were cracked in half, complete foundations were completely stripped with only a few pipes and rebar sticking up. The devastation was everywhere. You know what the most beautiful thing about what we saw was? As we drove in, we saw church buses and vans lined up along the roads. Baptist, Presbyterian, and here we were, a Methodist church all coming in to be the hands and feet of Christ. Then we met Sandy, a woman whose heart was broken for her broken community. Although she was spared a lot of the damage, we helped her, so she could continue to help others in ways we were unable. For instance, her and her husband, Donny, helped put a new roof on their uninsured next door neighbor's home after the storm. And there was so much more to do.

But as we heard story after story of what happened that stormy night, we pretty much got two perspectives on it. There were whiners, and there were winners. I don't mean to sound insensitive towards those that were hurt or even injured in these terrible storms but I believe that in all trials in our lives; tornado big or highway cut off small, we have a reaction to whine about it. Paul and Silas had been beaten and flogged to the brink of death. They were in prison with their feet in stocks and chains. In fact I would be the first to stand and say, Paul and Silas have every right to whine. I would say the tornado victims have every right to whine. In fact, some of our church staff like to point out how much I personally tend to whine about things that go wrong in my own life. But what amazes me is what Paul and Silas did next. Acts 16:25 says,

*<sup>25</sup> About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. NIV*

Did you catch that? After being beaten and flogged, they prayed and sang hymns to God. Paul and Silas did not whine. And I met plenty of people in Apison, TN who did not whine either. They rejoiced and sang and prayed and loved one another. They were grateful for their lives. Their possessions didn't seem to mean much anymore. There was a new outlook on life. God had delivered them in the way spared lives, and of church buses and vans coming to help. The community was rebuilding and starting over.

Those who stand in the face of adversity will be delivered. The rest of Paul and Silas' story also has them being delivered from their bondage. And even a better ending, the jailer and his family were saved in the end. Seriously, read it!! Trusting in God and responding faithfully to our trials says so much to the rest of the unbelieving world, and we will be winners in the end because of it. So in your next trial, how will you respond? Will you be a whiner or a winner?

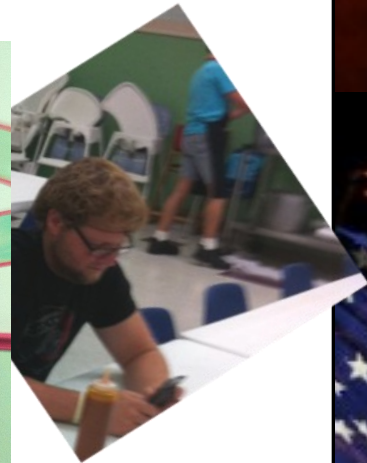


## LOVE IN STITCHES - JULY 2011
