But it was another significant day for Anthony. For his entire life he has been with or near one or both of his parents. The first day of school meant that he was venturing into life without us. Few of us probably remember what that is like, but the truth is it takes COURAGE. Fortunately, Anthony was up for it. He had pep talks from Alyssa and Andrew. He had hugs from Mommy and Daddy. But he was stepping into something new, foreign. It's also necessary. He needs to learn and grow in order to live in this world. He needs to believe that he can move forward. He needs to understand that he can stand on his own. And, hopefully he will one day know that he can be a leader with the skills he has learned.

Our walk with God is like walking into that Kindergarten the first day. Walking with God often takes us to thresholds that are frightening. I like to refer to our faith walk as a series of faith baby steps. When we step towards God it is frightening at first, but then we realize the blessing and grace God has to offer. So, we take the next step, a little bit wider step, a little bit more risk, a little more COURAGE required. That is how our faith grows, by taking the courage to follow Jesus.

This month we will talk about those new challenges and how God intends for us to be courageous in our faith as we talk about: The COURAGE to Believe, The COURAGE to Stand, and The COURAGE to Lead. At the same time the creators of the movie, “Fireproof” will release a new movie called ‘COURAGEOUS’ that talks about our families and how God is calling us to be courageous and reclaim our homes.

When Anthony came home from school he was wide eyed with excitement. He was a Kindergartner and the day was filled with wonderful experiences. He was COURAGEOUS and has been rewarded each day for that effort. God waits for you and me with incredible experiences of God's presence and grace as we take COURAGE to believe, stand and lead in the name of Christ. No more spiritual babies in this house!

Boom Boom, Jesus "Called" the Storm

This summer if you have been near any of our children on campus, chances are you may have heard of the new hit song of the summer written by our own Silly Sam and Summer Intern Mikayla Wagner. It was a mash-up of 5 bible stories from the Vacation Bible School Beach Blast. In the song there is a verse in which the children yell, BOOM BOOM, Jesus calmed the storm. But as I was listening to my daughter Ella sing the song I noticed that she was singing, BOOM BOOM, Jesus "Called" the storm. I tried to correct her but she argued with me telling me that she was right and I was wrong. I know what many of you are thinking. . . . totally my daughter. I finally convinced her by reading her the story of Jesus calming the storm, but I got to thinking . . . does God truly ever "call" the storm?

This last month, we have been exploring some old bible stories in our Sunday morning series, Collision. Stories like Adam and Eve, Cain and Abel, Noah and the Ark and the Incarnation of Jesus, help us to remember that God's grace comes in the aftermath his wrath as a result of our sin and punishment. Even at Sunday night student ministry Discover meeting, we have been discussing how God is Just in all things, even in His wrath.

We don't like to think about God's wrath too much do we? If the God that we always talk about is so loving, compassionate, forgiving and merciful why would we expect him to send His wrath? Have you ever read Isaiah 24? This might be one of those moments that you should grab your bible and read it. It's not exactly a joyful read. When we read it, the thing that we have to remind ourselves is that the seriousness of sin requires God's wrath on the world. But I love verses 14-16. We see here that Isaiah states that there will be cause for joy for those people who have stayed true to the Lord. They do not celebrate because of the judgment of sinners but because of His praiseworthy righteousness.

Sin is such a big deal to God that He sent His only Son to die for you. There is no escaping the fact that God desires to save you from His final judgment, but you must respond to His invitation to follow Him completely with your life. So I guess Ella is right. He did call the storm, and it is possible He still does because it is in His character. I don't dare pretend that I know God's thoughts about where and when He reveals his wrath, nor do I dare attribute bad things that happen in our lives a result of His wrath, but I do rejoice in His righteousness. I rejoice in the grace that comes from following Him, from receiving Christ as my savior. May we continue to live our lives in ways in which we always experience God's righteousness through his love, joy, grace, mercy, and compassion. With that, we can endure any storm he "calls" or calms. And please, don't mention this to Ella yet.
